

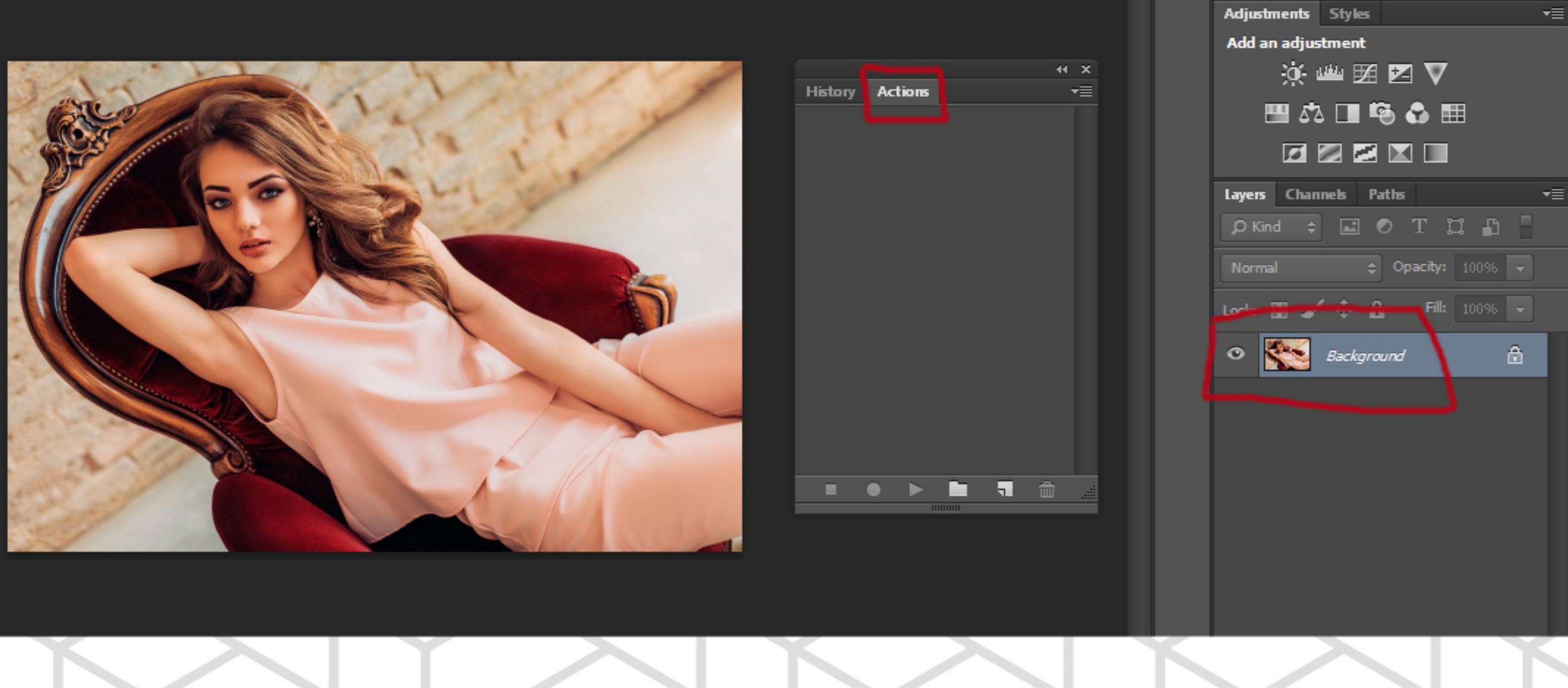
PHOTOSHOP ACTIONS HELP FILE

PART ONE = INSTALLING AND USING ACTIONS

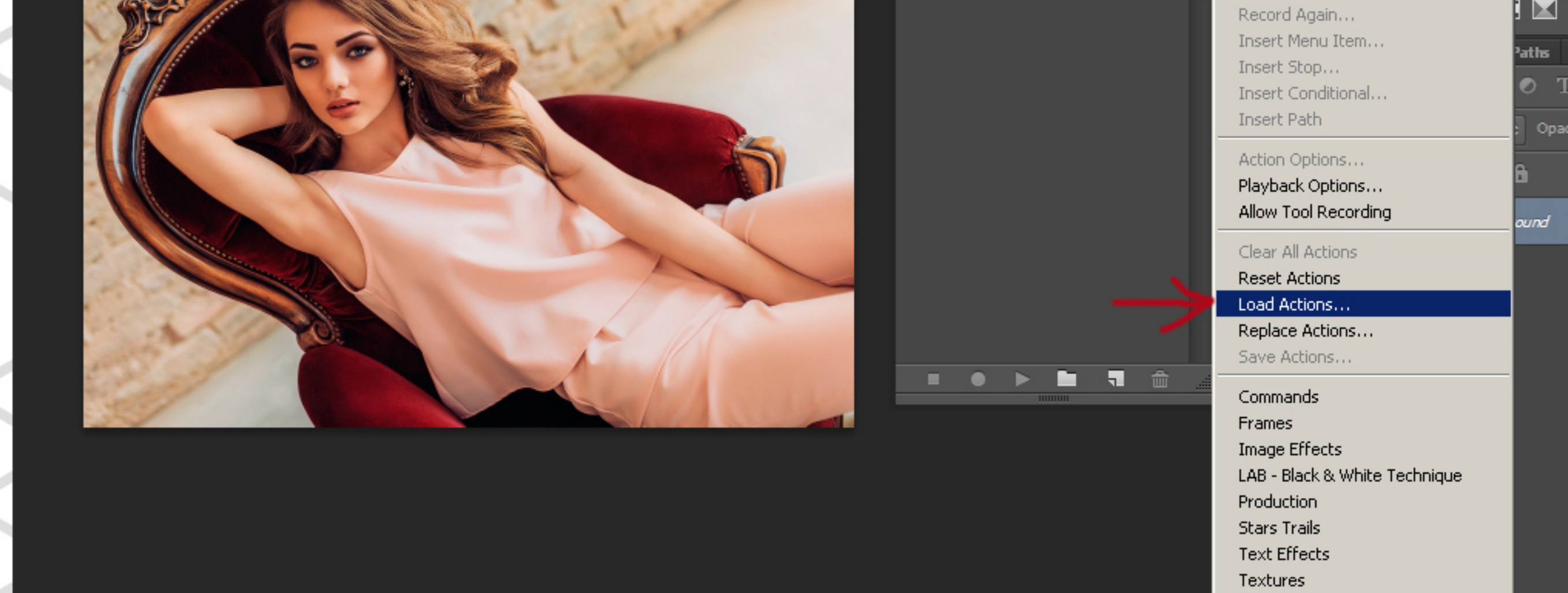
PART TWO = FADING THE OVERALL EFFECT OF THE FILTER

PART ONE = INSTALLING AND USING ACTIONS

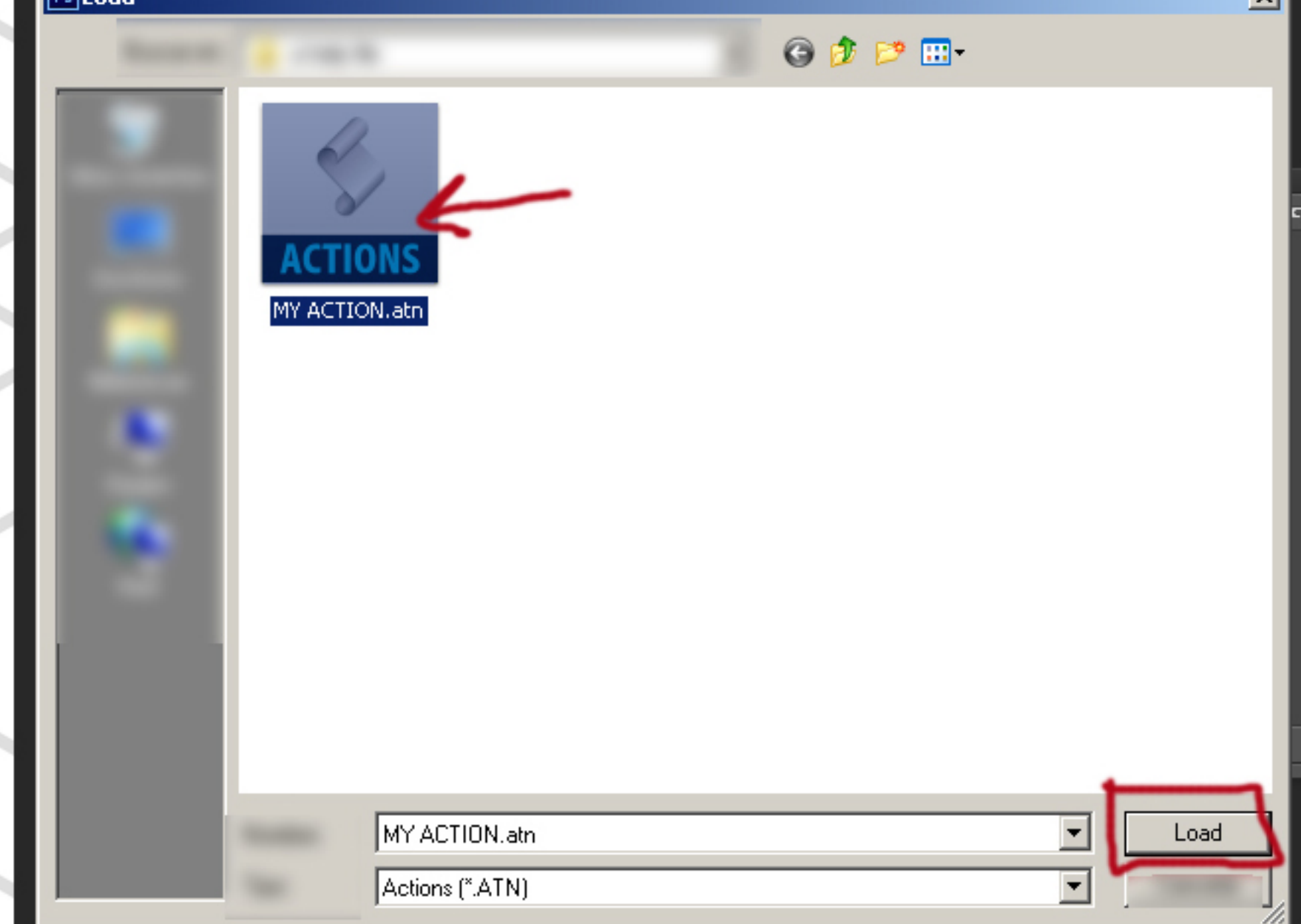
1- OPEN THE "ACTIONS" TAB (WINDOWS-ACTIONS)
BE SURE YOU ONLY HAVE THE "BACKGROUND"
LAYER ON THE "LAYERS" TAB. IF THERE'S MORE LAYERS
OR JUST "LAYER 0" GO TO "LAYER-FLATTEN IMAGE"



2- ON THE "ACTIONS" TAB, CLICK THE LITTLE BUTTON ON THE RIGHT AND SELECT "LOAD ACTIONS"

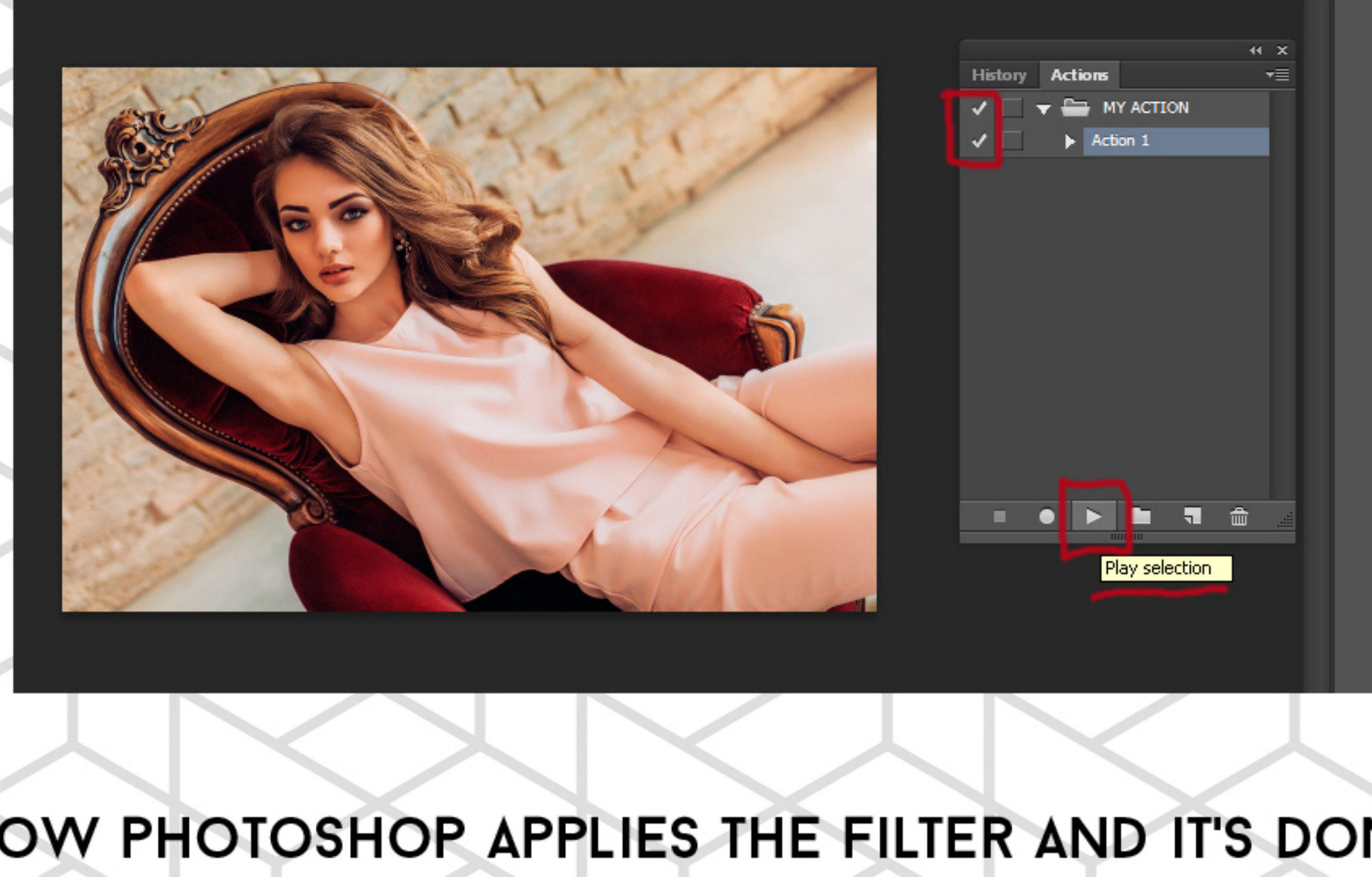


3- BROWSE THE ACTION YOU WANT TO INSTALL, SELECT IT AND CLICK "LOAD"

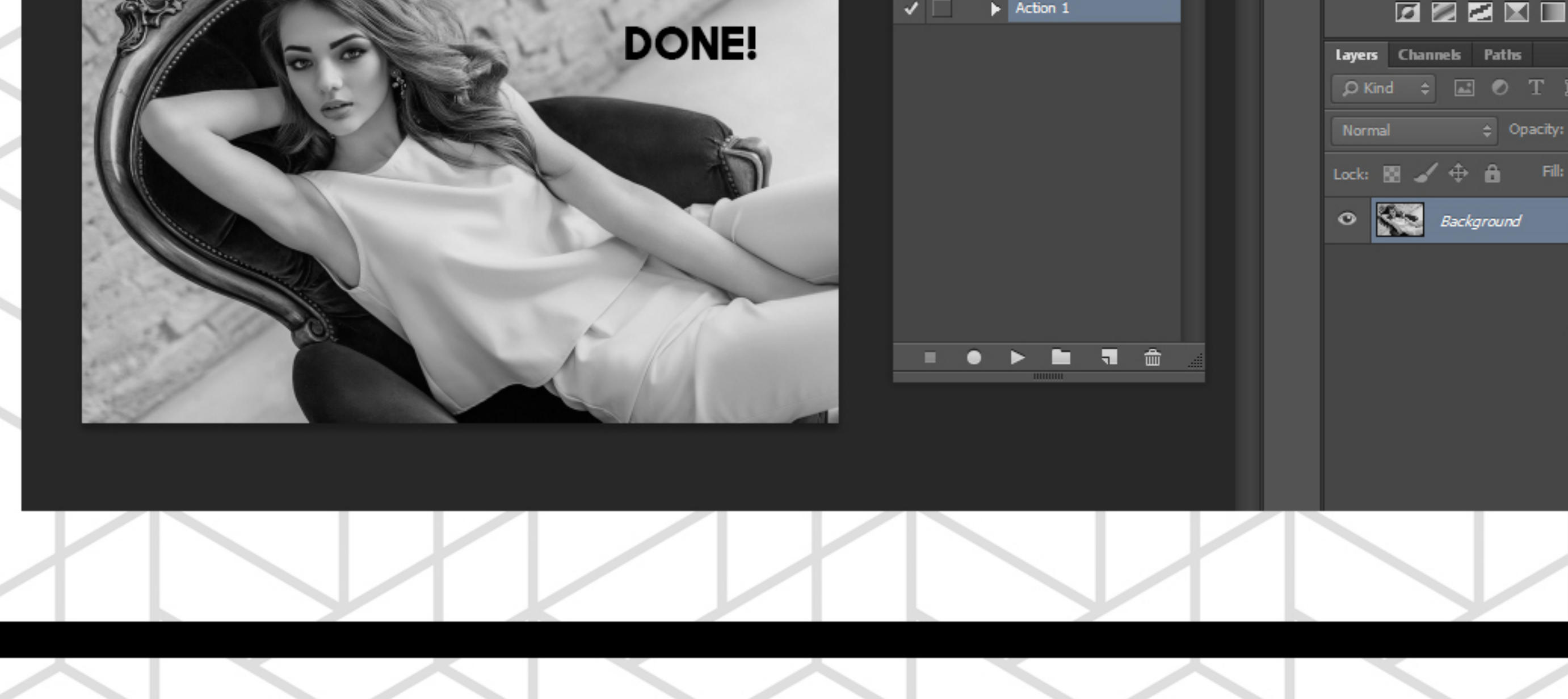


4- ONCE THE ACTION IS SHOWING, CLICK THE NAME AND THEN THE "PLAY" BUTTON ON THE BOTTOM OF THE BOX (PLAY SELECTION)

BE SURE THOSE LITTLE CHECKS ON THE LEFT ARE SHOWING, OTHERWISE NOTHING WILL HAPPEN



5- NOW PHOTOSHOP APPLIES THE FILTER AND IT'S DONE!

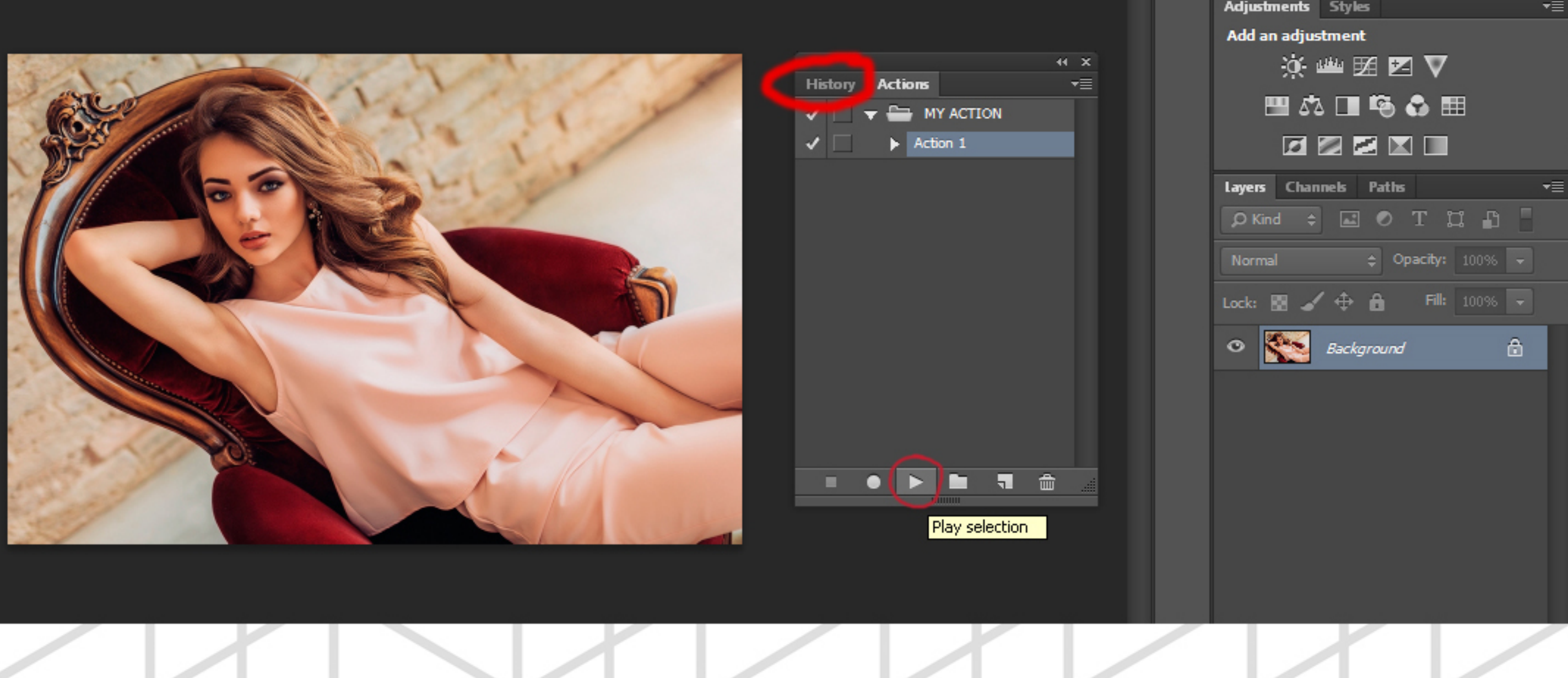


PART TWO = FADING THE OVERALL EFFECT OF THE FILTER

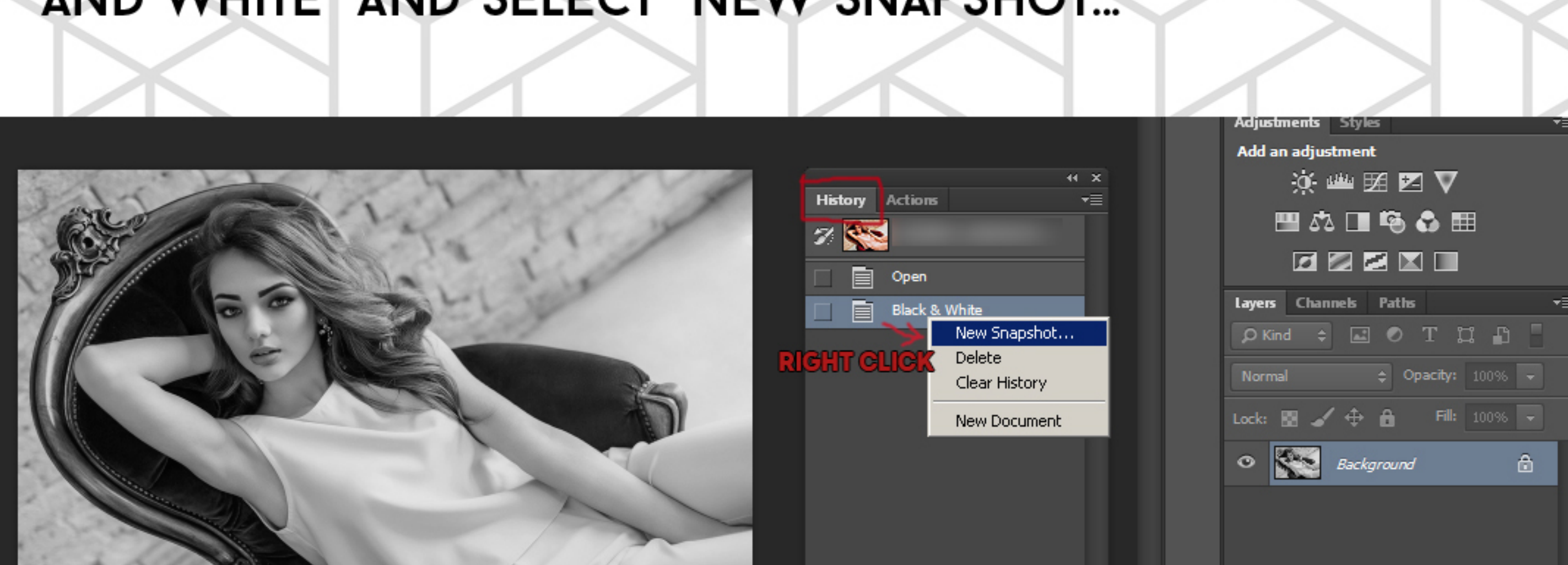
IF YOU HAVE USED APPS ON YOUR PHONE THAT APPLIE DIFFERENT FILTERS TO YOUR PHOTOS...YOU MAY HAVE NOTICED YOU CAN FADE THE FILTER TO MAKE IT MORE NATURAL OR JUST DIFFERENT...

THIS IS HOW YOU CAN DO IT ON PHOTOSHOP

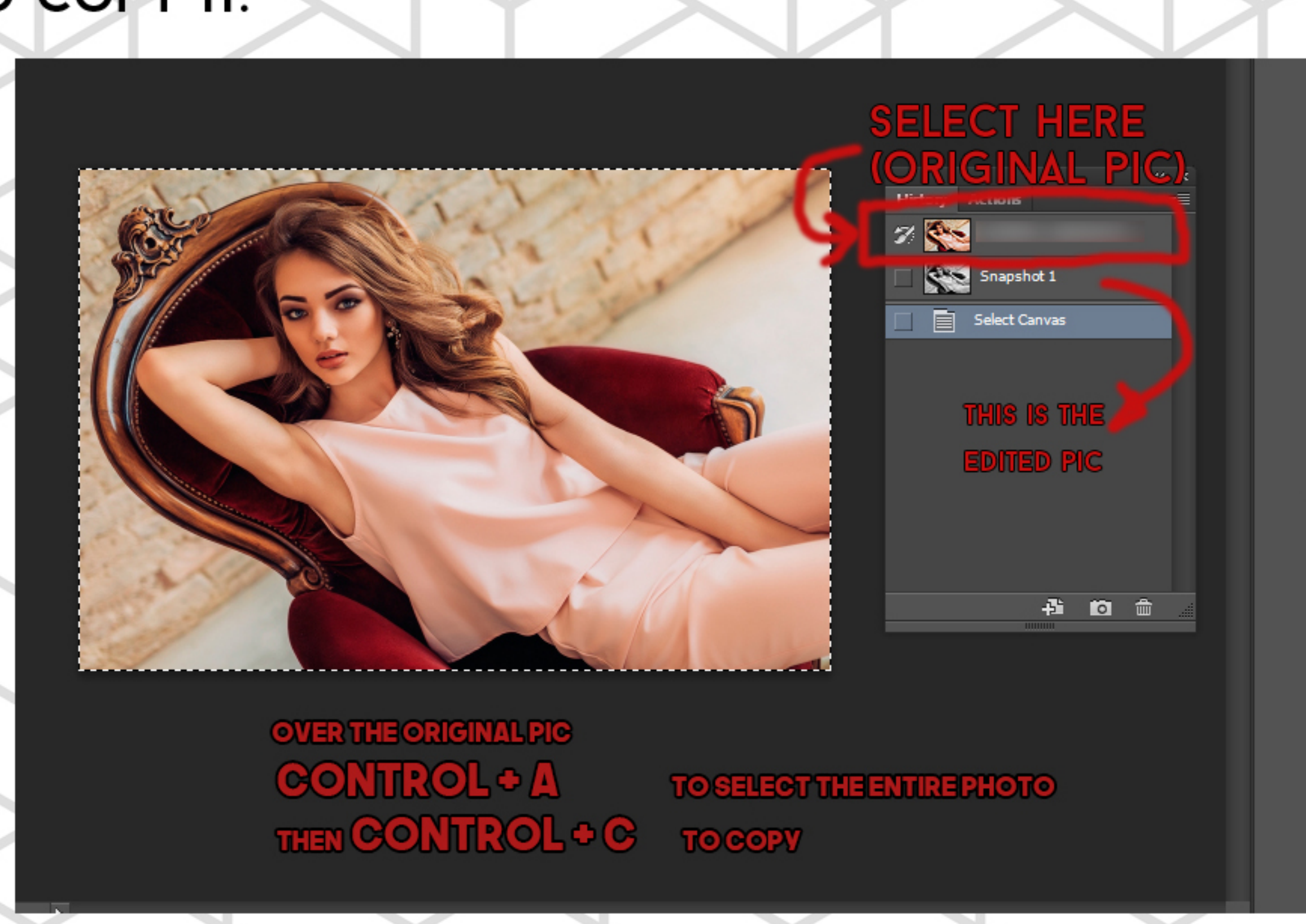
1- APPLY YOUR FILTER JUST LIKE WE JUST DID, BE SURE THE "HISTORY" TAB IS OPEN. IF NOT CLICK "WINDOWS-HISTORY" ON THE PHOTOSHOP MENU IT USUALLY OPENS NEXT TO THE ACTIONS TAB



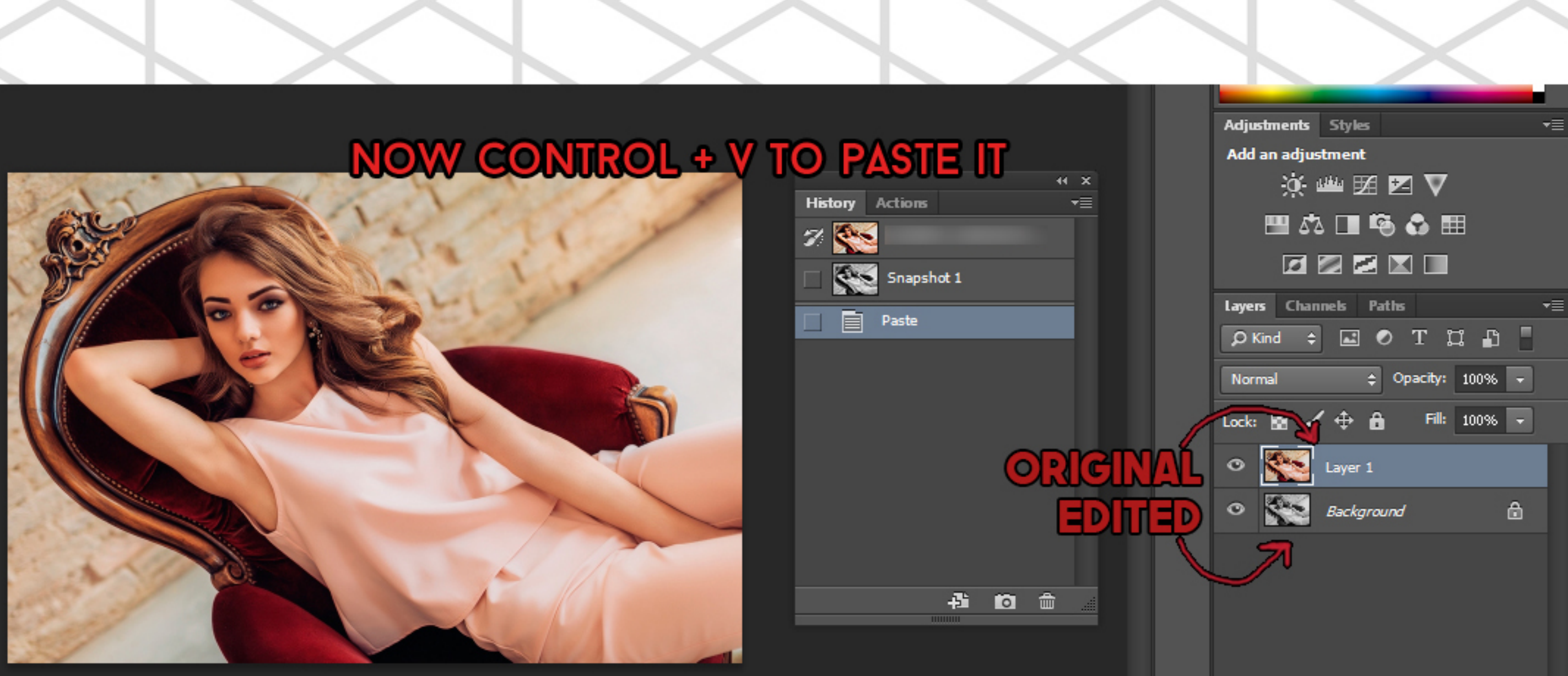
2- NOW JUMP TO THE "HISTORY" TAB AND RIGHT CLICK ON THE LAST STEP THE ACTION DID, IN THIS CASE IS THAT "BLACK AND WHITE" AND SELECT "NEW SNAPSHOT..."



3- NOW SELECT THE FIRST THUMBNAIL, WHICH IS THE ORIGINAL PICTURE WITHOUT ANY EDITION. TYPE CONTROL+A TO SELECT THE PHOTO AND THEN CONTROL+C TO COPY IT.



5- NOW TYPE "CONTROL + V" TO PASTE IT OVER THE EDITED PICTURE IT SHOULD LOOK LIKE THIS EXAMPLE, LAYER 1 IS THE ORIGINAL AND IT'S OVER THE BACKGROUND LAYER WHICH IS THE EDITED PICTURE



6- NOW TO FADE THE EFFECT, PLAY WITH THE "OPACITY" AND "FILL" OPTIONS ON LAYER 1, 0% ON BOTH WILL JUST SHOW THE EDITED PICTURE EXACTLY AS THE FILTER LEAVES IT. 50% WILL APPLY ONLY 50% OF THE FILTER AND SO ON (YOU CAN TYPE ANY NUMBER FROM 0 TO 100)
