

How to configure Photoshop to work with action

- **Make sure you are using the English version of Photoshop.**
- **Use the RGB Mode and 8 Bits color.**
To check these settings, go to Image->Mode and check the “RGB color” and “8 Bits/Channel”.
- **Make sure that the option “Add ‘copy’ to Copied Layers and Groups” and “Use Default Masks on Fill Layers” is turned on.**
On the “LAYERS” panel, click on the menu icon, go to “Panel Options...” and check that the “Add ‘copy’ to Copied Layers and Groups” is turned on. “Use Default Masks on Fill Layers” is turned on.

Image resolution

- **For the best results, it is recommended to use high resolution photos in the range of 1500px - 3500px.**

In order to get correct type scale

- **Use a photo with 72dpi.**

Go to Image->Image Size and change resolution to 72. Resample checkbox - off.

- **In order to get correct design scale**

Play “Small” action for 1000-2000px px photos.

Play “Medium” action for 2000-3000px photos.

Play “Large” action for 4000-<px photos.

How to use action

1. Open your image and be sure it is on the "Background" locked layer; (Layer - New - Background from Layer)
2. Double click on the "Modern graphic poster Action.atn" file to load it.
3. Double click on the "Graphic Poster Patterns.pat" file to load it.
4. Create a new layer and name it "AREA" (uppercase letters)
5. Paint on the layer the area that you need to focus. Use Pen Tool (P) in “shape” mode to make perfect area masks.
6. Click play on the action selected in the action panel.
7. After the action is finished, adjust the layer's location, size, and colors if needed.

Only 2 layers before action play
