

How to install Lightroom Presets

Welcome to Lightroom Presets installation guide! Here you will find installation instructions for Digital Goods Lab's Lightroom Presets. To begin with, choose the app you are using from the table of contents below.

Lightroom CC (Windows/Mac versions)

1. Download the .zip file with presets to your computer and unarchive it.
2. Open Lightroom CC and click the edit button at the top of the right sidebar panel (the button has an icon with 3 horizontal lines and circles on them) or hit the “E” key on your keyboard, after that the edit panel should appear.
3. Find the “Presets” button and click it: for the latest Lightroom versions it is located at the top left of the edit panel, for previous Lightroom versions it is located at the bottom of the edit panel. Now, the presets panel should appear, too.
4. Click on the icon of three dots at the top right of the presets panel.
5. In the dropdown menu select “Import Presets”.
6. Navigate to the unarchived .zip folder with the presets and choose the nested “XMP.zip” file, after that click the “Import” button.
7. Now, all imported presets should be listed in the presets panel.

Lightroom Mobile (iOS 13.0+)

If you have a paid version of Lightroom CC (Creative Cloud subscription), then it will be easier and faster to install presets in Lightroom CC on your Windows/Mac computer, and after that all your presets will be synchronized across all your devices, including Lightroom Mobile for iOS and Android. You can also install presets directly to Lightroom Mobile (for free, without any subscriptions).

1. Download the .zip file with presets to your iOS device. To do that, you need to open the download page via internet browser (e.g. Safari) on your iOS device and tap the download link, then you will be prompted to save the .zip file.
2. Using the built in “Files” app (in case you do not have it on your device, you may download it for free from the App Store [here](#) – it was created by Apple), tap the downloaded file to unarchive it. The new folder with nested files, including “DNG.zip” should appear.
3. Unarchive “DNG.zip” file in the same way using “Files” app, the new folder containing .dng files should appear.
4. Open Lightroom Mobile app.
5. [You may skip this step if you like] To keep your presets organized, select the “Library” tab, then tap the “+” icon and choose to create a

new “Folder” called “Presets” (in case if you do not already have such a folder). Then tap “Create New Album” and name the album after the downloaded presets.

6. Open the album created at step 5 or select “All Photos” and tap the three dots icon, then select “Add” photos “From Files” and select all “DNG” (with .dng extension) from the folder created at step 3. When you have selected all files, tap “Open”.
7. Open the first imported DNG image, then tap the three dots icon to open the context menu and select “Create Preset”.
8. Give a descriptive name for a new preset (we recommend to name your presets after the preset pack “[Name of presets pack] - [Number of the preset]” (e.g. “DGL Interiors - 1”)
9. In the “Preset Group” tap the “Create New Preset Group” and give a descriptive name for a new preset pack (we recommend to name your preset group after the preset pack) or select the existing one.
10. Uncheck “Tools”, “Optics” and “Geometry”. Press the tick to create the preset.
11. Repeat steps 8-10 with all remaining imported DNG images.
12. Now, all imported presets should be listed in the presets panel.

Lightroom Mobile (Android)

If you have a paid version of Lightroom CC (Creative Cloud subscription), then it will be easier and faster to install presets in Lightroom CC on your Windows/Mac computer, and after that all your presets will be synchronized across all your devices, including Lightroom Mobile for iOS and Android. You can also install presets directly to Lightroom Mobile (for free, without any subscriptions).

1. Download the .zip file with presets to your Android device. Using the built in “My Files” app, unarchive the downloaded .zip file. The new folder with nested files, including “XMP.zip” should appear.
2. Open Lightroom Mobile app and open any image from your library.
3. Scroll the context menu to the bottom to the right and tap the “Presets” tab, then tap the three dots icon. The new context menu should appear, then tap “Import Presets”.

4. The file explorer should appear on the screen. Navigate to the folder containing the “XMP.zip” file, which you got at step 1, and select the “XMP.zip” file for import.
5. Now, all imported presets should be listed in the presets tab.

Lightroom Classic (version 7.3+)

1. Download the .zip file with presets to your computer and unarchive it.
2. Open Lightroom Classic, then click on the “Develop” tab at the top right part of the app.
3. There is a section called “Presets” at the left sidebar panel, click the “+” icon at the top right of the section, then click the “Import Presets” context menu.
4. The file explorer should appear on the screen. Navigate to the folder containing the “XMP.zip” file, which you got at step 1, and select the “XMP.zip” file for import.
5. Now, all imported presets should be listed in the presets tab.

Photoshop (Adobe Camera RAW version 10.3+)

1. Download the .zip file with presets to your computer and unarchive it. You will see a nested “XMP.zip” archive file, unarchive it, too.
2. Navigate to the following folder on your computer:
[Windows] → “C:\Users\[Your Username]\AppData\Roaming\Adobe\CameraRaw\Settings”
[MacOS] → “[Your Username]/Library/Application Support/Adobe/Camera Raw/Settings”
3. Copy to the opened folder at step 2 all .xmp files (please note, that these files have .xmp extension) from unarchived “XMP.zip” file at step 1.
4. Open Photoshop (or restart it, if it has been already opened) and the presets will be ready for use.
