

## **How to install LUTs in DaVinci Resolve**

1. Open DaVinci Resolve on your computer. Open a project.
2. Click on the settings icon located in the bottom right corner. A new window will pop up.
3. Go to Color Management. Scroll down and find 'Lookup Tables'. Then click on 'Open LUT Folder'.
4. The LUT Folder window pops up. Drag and drop the entire downloaded and unzipped folder into the LUT Folder.
5. Close the LUT Folder. In the 'Color Management' tab (step 4), click 'Update Lists'.
6. Click 'Save'.

## **How to install LUTs in Premiere Pro**

If you are just applying a single LUT to your footage, an easy approach is to use the Browse... function and select the LUT from your downloads folder.

In Premiere Pro, open the Color workspace by clicking the Color tab at the top center of Premiere Pro.

1. Click on the clip you want to work with.
2. In the Lumetri panel, open the Basic Correction tab.
3. Under Basic Correction, select the Input LUT dropdown menu, and click on Browse...
4. Go to LUTs folder and select the LUT of your choice.

## **How to install LUTs in After Effects**

1. Make sure Effects & Presets panel is visible. If it's not, go to Window > Effects & Presets and click on it so a check mark appears.
2. In the Effects & Presets panel search for the term "LUT"
3. Drag and drop Apply Color LUT option onto your footage
4. In the dialog box select the LUT you'd like to apply
5. You've successfully applied a LUT to your footage

## **How to install LUTs in Final Cut**

This way is a simple quick 3 step process. Super easy to use LUTs.

1. Open the 'Effects' Browser and click the 'Color' tab
2. Drag and drop the 'Custom LUT' Plugin to your footage
3. Then you can simply import your LUT

## **How to install LUTs in Photoshop**

### **1. Unzip The LUTs**

In order to add the LUT to your project, you need to unzip it. This is pretty straightforward and you can either use a specialised software or the Windows built-in unzipping tool.

### **2. Open Your Project**

When talking about Photoshop, the project is usually an image, so go ahead and open that. Either by clicking on 'Ctrl+O' to open a new one, or import something from your cloud.

### **3. Create A New Color Look-Up Adjustment Layer**

You can do this by clicking the 'Color Lookup' button in the 'Adjustments' tab.

### **4. Open Your LUT**

Click on the 'Load 3D LUT' button, and then point Photoshop to the location you unzipped the LUT files to.
