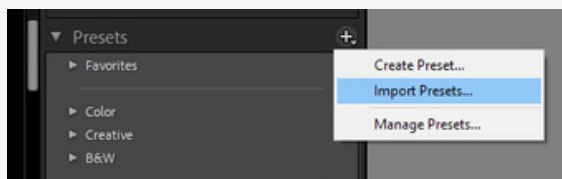

HOW TO INSTALL YOUR LIGHTROOM PRESETS

In Develop Mode, click the + next to the Presets menu and click Import Presets
Navigate to the zipped folder called "Inner Light Collection" and click Import



HOW TO INSTALL YOUR LOCAL ADJUSTMENT PRESETS

Adjustment brushes are not compatible with Lightroom CC or ACR

In Lightroom, go to: Edit > Preferences (or for Mac, click Lightroom > Preferences)

Click the Presets Tab

Click on the box that says: Show All Other Lightroom Presets

Double click the Lightroom Folder

Double click the Local Adjustment Presets folder

Copy the presets from the "BJP Local Adjustment Presets" folder into this folder.

Restart Lightroom.

HOW TO USE LOCAL ADJUSTMENT PRESETS

I've included three local adjustment presets in your download.

Facebright

One is called Facebright and I use it with the radial filter to brighten faces or subjects. Sometimes I use it for both if the image needs it. Once I apply it, I might bring down the strength of the whites or shadows, according to how much it needs.

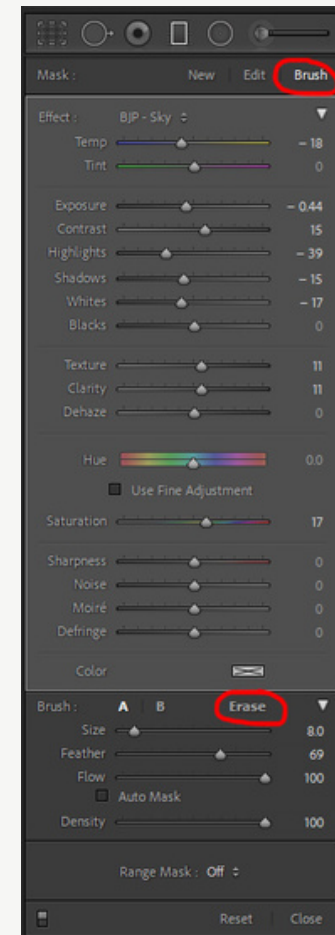
Sky

Another setting that is included is called Sky and you would use this with a graduated filter over the sky. If your subjects are getting some of the filter on them, I will go to the brush link (circled in red on the image to the right) and then to erase (also circled in red), and erase it off the subjects. Just be very careful to not end up with a halo around your subjects.

Be sure to adjust the settings to suit the image. Definitely adjust the Temp slider at the top, because sometimes you may not want that much blue tint (like on an overcast sky).

Sun Warmer

The last setting is for warming up your sun! It's pretty simple, just use it with a radial filter and put it over your sun to bring out the vibrancy and yellow tones.
